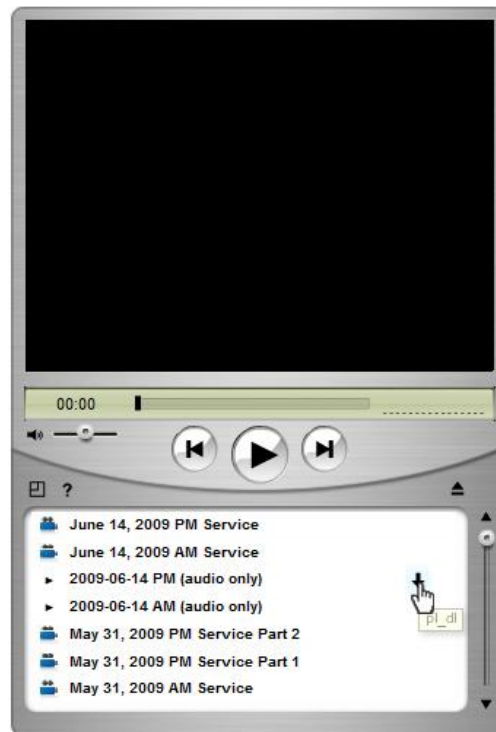
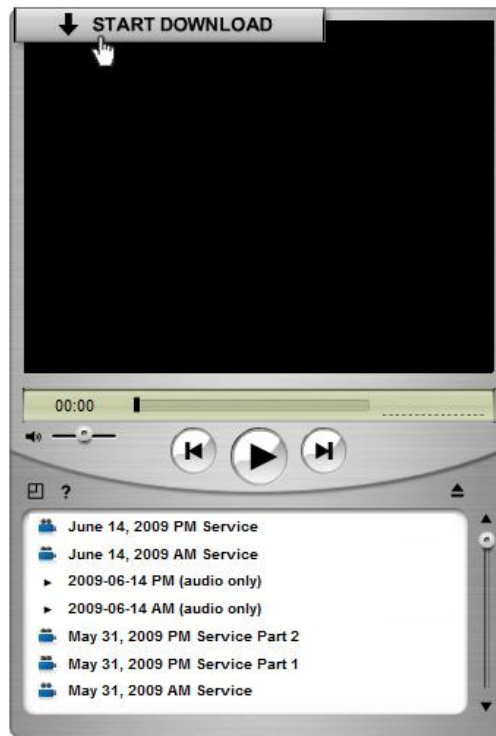


Faith Baptist Church – Sermon Download Instructions*

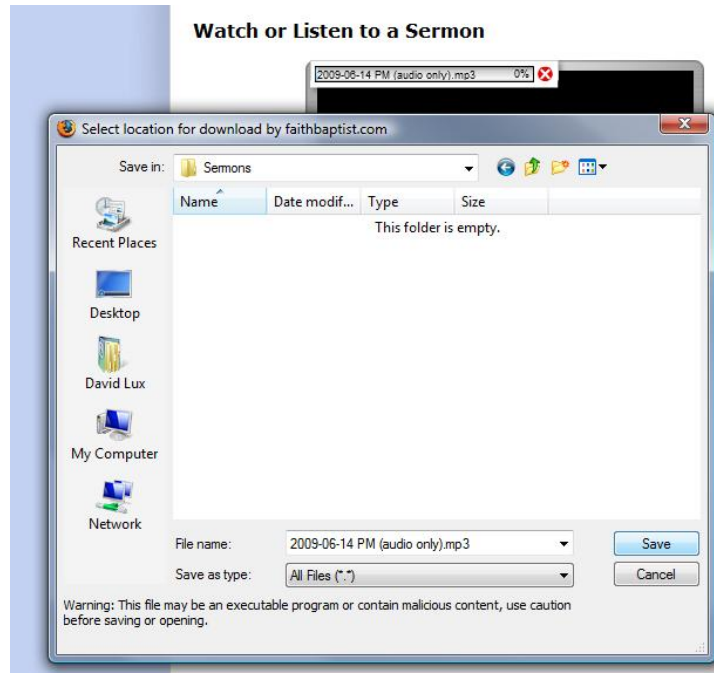
1. Begin by choosing the sermon you wish to download
2. Hover over the area to the right of the File Name to begin the download process (see screenshot) until you see a black arrow
3. Click on the black arrow



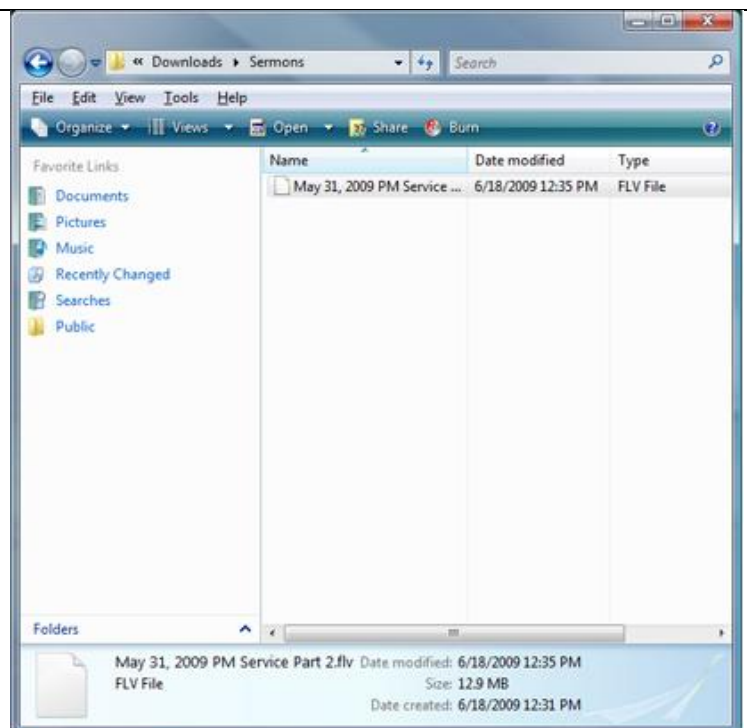
4. A menu will appear at the top of the video/audio player (see screenshot)
5. With your mouse, click where it says "Start Download"
6. This will launch a popup window where you can choose to save the file.



7. Select the location where you would like to save the file
8. Once you have selected the location where you would like to save the file, click "Save"
9. The bar at the top of the player will now show you a progress meter letting you know the status of the download. When the file has finished downloading it will say "Done". The file may be canceled at any time by clicking on the red "X".
10. If the file you chose was an audio file, you should be able to play the file without any issues – if the file was a video file there are a couple more steps you may want to continue reading this guide.

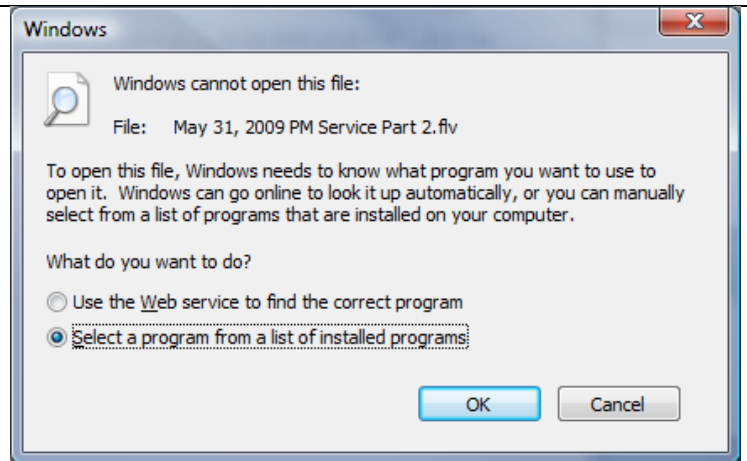


11. Locate the video file you downloaded and double-click on the file



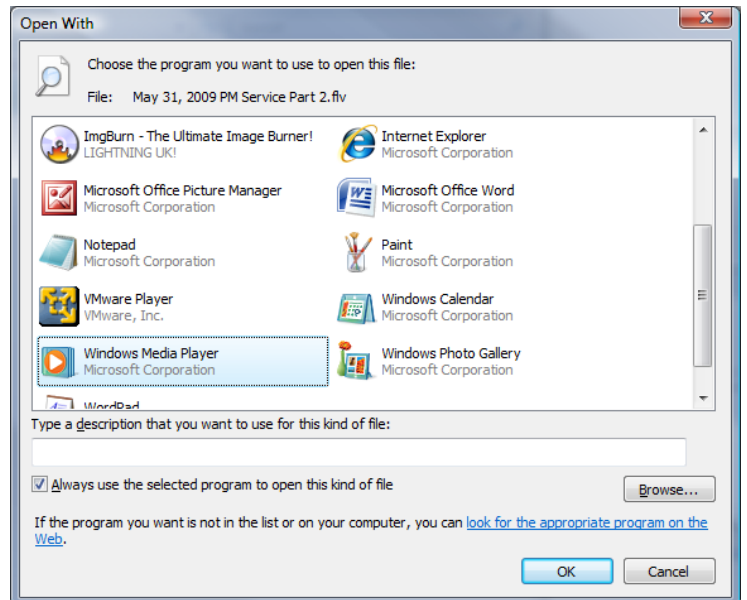
12. You may see a message like this (see screenshot)

13. Choose the option to “Select a program from a list of installed programs” and then click “OK”.



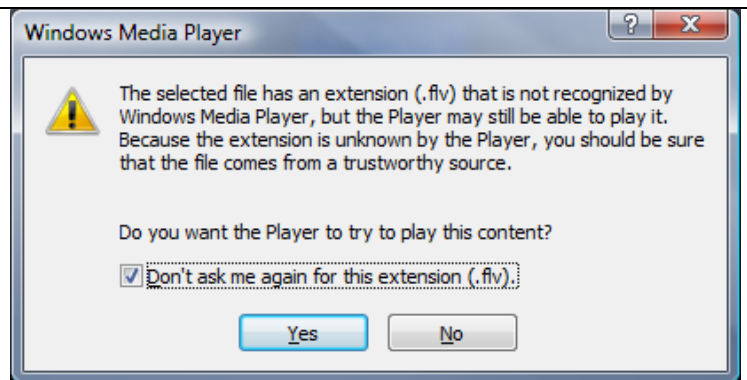
14. Look for the program “Windows Media Player” under the list of available programs. If it is not listed under “Recommended Programs” you may be able to locate it under “Other Programs” or by browsing to “C:\Program Files\Windows Media Player” and clicking on “wmplayer.exe”. You may also choose to check the box (or leave the box checked) that says “Always use the selected program to open this kind of file”.





15. Once this process is finished, click “OK” to continue.
Note: This will automatically launch Windows Media Player





16. You may see the following dialogue box – simply check the box and click “Yes” to proceed.

17. The Video will hopefully start playing after clicking “Yes”.



<p>18. If you see this message (see screenshot) you will need to close Windows Media Player and download/install an additional program that will give your computer the ability to play Flash (.flv) files.</p>	
<p>19. Click on the following link: http://www.playflv.com/</p> <p>20. Click on the “Download Now” link at the top of the page.</p> <p>21. Click on “Save File” to save the file to a location .</p> <p>22. Locate the file “PlayFLV.exe” and run the file.</p>	
<p>23. You may need to click “OK” to a couple of standard Windows messages, but you should arrive at this screen (see screenshot)</p> <p>24. Un-check the box called “Start Menu Shortcuts” and then click “Next >”</p> <p>25. Select the location to install the program (the default location should be fine) and click “Install”</p>	
<p>26. You will see this popup message (see screenshot)</p> <p>27. Click “Yes” to install FFDSHOW</p>

Follow all of the default prompts to install FFdshow – there are several screens with several options, just keep clicking the options needed to move through the install process accepting all the options you are given. You should eventually see this screen (see screenshot)</p> <p>30. Click “Finish”</p> <p>31. You should now be able to double-click on any FLV file (e.g. Step 11 above) you download from the Faith Baptist website and watch it on your computer.</p> <p>If you have additional difficulties, you can always watch the sermons online but may also be able to receive additional assistance by searching Google for “trouble playing FLV file” or another similar search query.</p>	 <p>The screenshot shows a Windows "Setup" window titled "Completing the FFdshow Setup Wizard". *Note: These instructions are a general guideline for getting a Windows PC set up to download files from our website and play FLV files on your Windows PC. The screenshots in this guide may not exactly match what you see on your own computer and (depending on your version of Windows) FLV playback may not be supported. You may also need to upgrade Windows Media Player in order for these instructions to work. If you are having major difficulties downloading and watching videos on your PC it may be best to watch the videos from the church website.
